"The Lord sends it", she once said – "We do his work, He provides the means."

Mother Teresa said, "I can tell you about my path, but I'm only a little wire. God is the power. I always begin my prayer in silence. It is in the silence of the heart that God speaks. We need to listen because it is not what we say but what he says to us and through us that matters. As blood is to the body, prayer is to the soul."


